


Among the various ways to direct or indirect feedback, the SSS is the most significant one. Here is the brief report of our SSS in 2019.

There were a total 09 students in the second year in early 2019. All 09 responded to our survey. The outcome, the analysis and the action points drawn by the team HACSE are presented here.

Our IOAC has selected 7 benchmarks for ensuring quality for 3 to 4 batches with reference to 20 quantitative parameters set by NAAC. We are committed to achieve high score on all 20 parameters. However, these 7 would be focused more in phase 1. Here are the parameters and the set **benchmark** level we target to achieve.

- 1. Coverage of syllabus 95%
- 2. Communication skills of the teachers Always Effective
- 3. Fairness of IA Usually fair
- 4. Mentoring very well
- 5. Concept illustration usually good
- 6. Student centric activities Great extent
- 7. use of ICT tools 90%

All the best to all of us in the journey towards sustained quality assurance.

## **Analysis of Parameters (5 point rating scale)**

The Student satisfaction Survey has been conducted. All 09 students from the batch 2019 have responded to it. Total 20 questions as prescribed in NAAC guidelines were asked with a little modifications in section of demographic details. No change in main content of the tool was made. The questionnaire has been converted in to Google form and responses were collected through online mode. Following are the analysis of few parameters based on the responses received.

# Analysis of Few Parameters: (complete analysis is attached. Presented here is the report of 7 parameters selected as benchmark in phase 1)

### Analysis of Question-1- About the Coverage of Syllabus

The college always has a target of the coverage of minimum of 95% of the syllabus. Question number -1 was with regard to the coverage of syllabus according to the students. The analysis of the responses reflects that out of 5, 9 students responded that between 85-100% of the syllabus was covered whereas 4 students responded that 70-84% of the syllabus was covered in class. Figure no. 1 is self explanatory for this analysis.



#### **Analysis of Question-3- Communication skills of Teachers**

With an objective to always have an effective and transparent communication with students, it was asked that how well were the teachers able to communicate? 5 out of 9 students were responded that communication of teachers has always been effective where as 3 students reported that it was sometimes effective. 1 student reported that it was just satisfactory. Figure no. 2 is self explanatory for this analysis.



Analysis of Question-5- Fairness of IA

College has always put its effort to maintain a fair Internal Assessment policy for students. In response to it, 7 out of 9 students reported that college has always been fair towards their IA process whereas 1 student responded that teachers were usually fair towards the IA process for students. 1 student responded that it was sometimes unfair of IA practices. Figure no. 3 is self explanatory for this analysis.



Analysis of Question-8- About Mentoring

In response to the question about the teaching and mentoring process to facilitate in cognitive, social and emotional growth, 2 students reported as significantly whereas 4 students felt that mentoring system was very well provided for the growth of students. 3 students responded that mentoring process was moderately done. Figure no. 4 is self explanatory for this analysis.



#### **Analysis of Question-12- About Concept Illustration**

In response to the question asked that whether teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications, 5 students responded as every time whereas 2 students reported that usually teachers illustrate the concept during lectures and other academic activities. 2 students responded as occasionally the concepts were illustrated during lectures. Figure no. 5 is self explanatory for this analysis.



Analysis of Question-16- About the Use of Student Centric Methods

In response to the question asked that whether the institute/teachers use student centric methods for enhancing learning experiences, 5 out of 09 students felt that student centric methods were used to great extent whereas 1 student found it at moderate level. 2 students felt that it was somewhat done where as 1 student felt that it was very little done with the students. 

#### Analysis of Question-19- About the Use of ICT Tool

In response to the question asked that what percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, multimedia etc. While teaching, 6 out of 09 students responded as the uses of ICT were above 90 % whereas 2 students reported that the use of ICT were between 70-89% during teaching. 1 student reported that ICT was used around 50-69%. Figure no. 7 is self explanatory for this analysis.



#### Conclusion

The data was collected from 09 students through online survey. Conclusion were drawn from the data received. Although the responses are not too deviated from the set benchmark under the respective parameters yet there is a need to relook into certain parameters such as communication skills of the teachers and students, mentoring process teaching methodologies to enhances quality services for the students at institute level. Based on the previous action points which were taken care of, it was observed that more students were satisfied with the IA process.

#### Analysis of Qualitative data 2019 (Item # 21)

In response to asking three observation/ suggestions to improve overall teaching-leaning experiences in institution, majority of the **students expressed their happiness and appreciated** the efforts and practices HACSE has been taking up keeping the students at the centre stage. These responses about being satisfied are not mentioned here since the focus is on the improvement points.

Following are a few short listed points for improvements suggested by students.

- **1.** More focus on practice teaching may be given in B Ed LD program.
- 2. Counselling sessions for students may be arranged.
- 3. Need exposure practical assessment of children with LD. (Or else at least practically show how to Asses using DTLD).
- 4. I loved exploring all types of disability in Mumbai that was the best part. But I would suggest that the college can take students to other parts of Maharashtra to explore more so that students can have idea about condition of other city or village.
- 5. Please facilitate students for Online learning

#### Points marked for action 2019

Based on the responses received from the students, the following suggestions have been considered as the action taken points.

- 1. Counselling services are already existent but will be communicated well to students and it would reflect the time table.
- 2. Scopes to increase the exposure in detailed understanding about the practicum will be relooked.
- 3. Educational visits across the Maharashtra state will be discussed and possibilities will be explored. One educational tour per batch is practiced in the college. Hence, this point would not be marked for high priority.
- 4. Exposure to DTLD would be reviewed.
- 5. Online learning opportunities for students and alumni will be created.
- 6. College will maintain the practice of directing the students for self reflection which has already been in practice since many years.
- 7. Practice of feedback system will also be maintained as before and will be upgraded time to time.
