Relevance of feedback was always understood well by our college. But after the first round of the NAAC process, we started looking at it in a more structured way. Now, more than ever before - CCYM's HACSE intends to be a feedback governed system where feedback management is systematic and is an essential component of academic decision making. Understanding the fact that who could give the apt feedback but the student themselves, IQAC of the college leaves no stone unturned to find out what our 'clients' feel about us.

Among the various ways to direct or indirect feedback, the SSS is the most significant one. Here is the brief report of our SSS in 2021-2022.

There were a total 13 students in 2021-2022. All 13 responded to our survey. The outcome, the analysis and the action points drawn by the team HACSE are presented here.

Our IQAC has selected 7 benchmarks for ensuring quality for 3 to 4 batches with reference to 20 quantitative parameters set by NAAC. We are committed to achieve high score on all 20 parameters. Analysis of Parameters (5 point rating scale)

The Student satisfaction Survey has been conducted. All 13 students from the batch 2020-2022 have responded to it. Total 20 questions as prescribed in NAAC guidelines were asked with a little modifications in section of demographic details. No change in main content of the tool was made. The questionnaire has been converted in to Google form and responses were collected through online mode. Following are the analysis of few parameters based on the responses received.

Analysis of Few Parameters: (complete analysis is attached. Presented here is the report of 7 parameters selected as benchmark in phase 1)

Analysis of Question-1- About the Coverage of Syllabus

The college always has a target of the coverage of minimum of 95% of the syllabus. Question number -1 was with regard to the coverage of syllabus according to the students. The analysis of the responses reflects that 46.2% students responded that between 85-100% of the syllabus was covered whereas 38.5% students responded that 70-84% of the syllabus was covered in class. Figure no. 1 is self-explanatory for this analysis.






5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers. 13 responses











Analysis of Qualitative data 2022

In response to the question asked that give three observation/ suggestions to improve overall teaching-leaning experiences in institution, students expressed their opinion to make the system more student friendly.

Following are the points for improvements suggested by students under the question number 21.

- 1. Practical demonstration of the techniques could be provided. The feedback of the marks and the assignments could be discussed before the next submission. Improvisation points must be provided so that the scope of scoring could be possible.
- 2. Learning experience is very good. Only one problem was that due to corona all the lectures went online. So some technical problems had to be faced but teachers handled it very well.
- 3. Exposure of more case studies of students, their challenges and what kind of strategies to be used, experiences with children having severe / profound impairments and experiences / learnings related to counselling of parents need to be incorporated.
- 4. Discussion with each student, knowing if there is anything- socially, physically or emotionally going through which is hindering the learning process need to be done.
- 5. Constructive feedback on the assignments need to be given to the students.
- 6. Students should be trained for presenting the idea and skills to represent. (Extra subject kind)
- 7. Communication between teachers and students need to be improved.
- 8. Work on mind captivating teaching methods has to be done.
- 9. Show enthusiasm while teaching.
- 10. Improvement is required in providing clarity with respect to assignments.
- 11. Expand the area of teaching and learning methods.
- 12. No suggestions for the college because they are providing everything to the students.
- 13. To give more of practical knowledge.
- 14. It's good.
- 15. Use different methods of teaching.
- 16. Provide enough material to study.
- 17. More application based exposure is needed.
- 18. Plan more activities related to topic.
- 19. Always give feedback for the assignment which is missing from teacher.
